In a sense, the rabid race fan finds Bob Tator a complete enigma. — RULES OF RACING —

A complete record is kept by the Handicaper of all cars in the United Stock Car Club, Inc. Their performance during the last 3 race events on any track in the circuit determines where the cars should start in tonights meet here at Rhinebeck. This is known as Point Standings. The Reverse Start is being used . . . this means that slowest or lowest point cars start in front of faster or higher point cars.

After the Starting Flag is given by Starter, it's every man for himself in trying to take and keep the lead to win. The Racing Stock Cars are "rougher" during races than any other type of Auto Racing and frequent "crashes", "bumps", and "metal bending" is expected. No driver will deliberatly disable a competitor's car although accidents happen due to tire blowouts, sudden spins, etc. . . .

The Black (disqualification) flag is used by the Starter when some mechanical trouble develops in a car which the driver may not be able to see and which might make a car dangerous.

The Yellow Flag means caution and there is no passing until the Green Flag is given, except when someone is lapping cars which is to be done with extreme caution. Any driver who shall gain positions on Caution flag shall be penalized the same number of positions gained at the end of the race regardless of whether the car or cars he has passed remains in the race or not. Yellow flag shall not be held on race for more than three consecutive laps, at the end of the third lap and at the beginning of the fouth lap either the

green or red flag must be dropped. If the red flag is dropped, the preceeding laps under Caution shall not be counted in the scoring. If the Green flag is used, the laps shall be counted.

The Red flag means the race must immediately be stopped regardless of the position of the cars on the track, all moving automobiles must be stopped immediately and the track made clear for the ambulance or tow-cars.

When a car turns over or when more cars are involved in an accident and can't get started again so that traffic stays blocked, or for any other reason in the Starters opinion the track is unsafe to continue the race, he drops the Red flag.





gardless of the ultimate result, the hard driving Tator will take his chances. In most instances this tact has paid off handsomely but there have been times when the same tactics have backfired, almost bringing to an end a promising career.

Bob remembers most of the flips he has been involved in but perhaps the most vivid occured in the last midget race in which he participated. This was early in 1948 and he was very seriously injured after rolling his mount end over end. When he was pulled out of the battered wreck he was more dead than alive and it was three days before he regained consciousness. That brought a temporary halt to his driving activities.

With the introduction of the racing stock cars to the east last year, the old urge to be sitting behind a wheel in the merry chase around the macadam ovals reasserted itself. It was not long before he had made the adjustment to this new type of speedway activity and prior to the closing of the outdoor season was giving the top notchers all they could handle. Here at Rhinebeck he was the third ranking high point man and in a never to be forgotten finish nipped Jokko Maggiacomo at the wire to annex the Hudson Valley Championship. During the indoor season at the Kingsbridge Armory in the Bronx, he bested a star studded field to capture the 1949 indoor 50 lap championship grind in a manner calculated to leave no doubt in the minds of fans and drivers alike, that he could run with and take the measure of the best car jockeys in the business.

Bob's rooters, and they are many, are looking for him to accomplish even greater things in this 1950 season while most observers agree that the 26 year old Rhinebeck resident has the ability to come through in handsome style. No matter what the future holds for the enthusiastic spectators who turn out to watch the souped up stocks, one thing is certain; the man behind the wheel of car 19 will never turn in a dull performance.
